

NOTICE OF MAKING
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984
LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

**(GOLGOTHA ROAD, LANCASTER, LANCASTER CITY) (REVOCATION AND PROHIBITION
OF WAITING) ORDER 2026**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on 13th August 2026 Lancashire County Council made the above Traffic Regulation Order under Sections 1, 2 and 4 AND/OR 45 and 46 AND/OR 92 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the effect of which will be to:

1. Revoke the following:
 - a) The "Lancashire County Council (Lancaster Area) (On Street Parking Places, Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Consolidation Order 2009" insofar as it relates to Item (4) of Schedule 11.040.
 - b) The "Lancashire County Council (Golgotha Road, Bowerham, Lancaster City) (Part Revocation, Prohibition of Waiting and Limited Waiting) Order 2013" in full.
2. Introduce a prohibition of waiting in the following lengths of road:
 - a) Golgotha Road, Lancaster, the north east side, from its junction with the centreline of Coulston Road for a distance of 54 metres in a north westerly direction;
 - b) Golgotha Road, Lancaster, the south west side, from its junction with the centreline of Coulston Road for a distance of 52.5 metres in a north westerly direction.

This Order will come into force on the 31st August 2026. A copy of the Order, and all other relevant documents may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of Lancaster City Council, Town Hall, Dalton Square, Lancaster, LA1 1PJ, and at the offices of The Director of Law and Governance, Lancashire County Council, County Hall, PO Box 100, Preston PR1 0LD, and on Lancashire County Councils Website <https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/roads-parking-and-travel/roads/roadworks-and-traffic-regulation-orders/permanent-traffic-regulation-orders/>, quoting ref: **LSG4/894_19553/AFR**. Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Act, or that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under the Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the order is made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
